## RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

- All classes are open. All exhibits must be grown or made by the exhibitor and not previously entered in the show. Violation of this rule means entrance fee and prize money will be forfeited. The Committee reserves the right to refuse to accept any entry and to inspect the garden of any exhibitor at any time after entries are received.
- Please take your Entry Form\* and Entry Fees, as soon as possible (by Saturday 21st July), to Mr K Stead, 3 Bruce Close, Broughton, Brigg. Entries will also be accepted on Sunday 22nd July at the Show **between 8.30am and 9.30am**, at the discretion of the Committee and subject to space. **All adult entries accepted on the day of the show will be subject to an increased fee of 30p per entry.** Entries for Floral Arrangements must be notified by noon on Saturday 21st July.  
\*(All exhibits must be taken to the Sports Centre on the morning of the Show).
- Exhibitors must supply their own trays, vases etc. Exhibits must be in the Show Area arranged and ready for judging by 10.30am and must remain until 4.45pm. **Exhibitors must leave the Show Area by 10.30am**, for judging to commence at **10.45am**.
- The Committee will not be responsible for the incorrect staging of any article. The Committee does not hold itself responsible for any loss or damage.
- Prize money will be paid out between 3.00pm and 4.00pm on Show Day. If prize money is not claimed within three days, it will be deemed given back to the Society.
- Cups and Trophies awarded to exhibitors remain the property of the Broughton Agricultural Society. They will be held for one year and must be handed back in good condition by 1<sup>st</sup> July.
- Any objections must be in writing to the Secretary before 3.00pm with a deposit of 50p, refundable if the objection is upheld. The decision of the Committee is final.
- Reference to the "Committee" means the Committee appointed by the Broughton Agricultural Society to organise this section.
- 1st, 2nd and 3rd Prizes may be awarded in classes containing 4 or more entries. The Judges may award up to 2 prizes in any class attracting 3 or less entries, and may be any combination of 1st, 2nd or 3rd. They may withhold prizes if the exhibits are not to the required standard.  
**THE JUDGES DECISION IS FINAL.**
- Entry Fees: Adult classes 25p per entry (30p on Show day). All children's entries are FREE.
- Points and Prizes will be awarded as follows:  
Adult Classes      1st = 5pts / £2.50    2nd = 3pts / £2.00    3rd = 1pt / £1.00  
Children's Classes    1st = 5pts / £1.50    2nd = 3pts / 1.00    3rd = 1pt / 50p
- Exhibitors should not remove their exhibits and prize cards until after the Presentation of Prizes. If you are unable to leave them until after the awards are presented, please do not enter them for judging.** Any exhibits not removed by 5.00pm will be deemed donated to the Society and will be sold, with all proceeds going to the Society for the running of the Show.
- Other matters arising which are not covered by these rules shall be left to the discretion of the Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding.
